STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Elmira H. Dunbar of Cherryfield.

Resolved, That there be paid to Elmira H. Dunbar of
2 Cherryfield a pension of six dollars per month, commencing
3 the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seven, and
4 continuing during the pleasure of the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Elmira H. Dunbar is the dependent widow of Alfred F. Dunbar, late a private in the Cherryfield Light Infantry under command of Capt. Hiram Burnham in the Aroostook war. She is eighty-four years of age and has no property except a small dwelling very much out of repair, and is dependent wholly on her own labor and the support furnished by three daughters, or in fact, by one daughter, a dressmaker, sixty years old, the next younger being the housekeeper and the youngest is a confirmed invalid.
