

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the towns of Howland and Enfield for the purpose of repairing bridge across the Penobscot River.

Resolved, That the sum of thirteen hundred dollars be 2 and hereby is appropriated for and in behalf of the towns 3 of Howland and Enfield to be expended under the direction of the road commissioner of said towns for the purpose of repairing the bridge across the Penobscot river 6 between said towns.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge, which spans the Penobscot river between the towns of Howland and Enfield of 920 feet in length, is so situated as to accommodate the traveling public form the Arooostook county, the northern part of Penobscot county, Piscataquis and the northern part of Kennebec county, it being the only crossing by bridge from Oldtown to the head waters of the Penobscot river. This bridge, owing to so much travel, has to be planked every two years at an average cost of eleven hundred dollars, which is a great burden for poor towns.
