STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Daniel R. Palmer of Buckfield.

Resolved, That there be paid to Daniel R. Palmer of
2 Buckfield, in the county of Oxford, the sum of six dollars
3 per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated
4 for military pensions and beginning January first, 1907,
5 and to continue during the pleasure of the Legislature.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Daniel R. Palmer was a member of Co. C, 23d Me. Vol. Inf. during the Civil War and now draws a pension of twelve dollars per month from the Federal Government for injuries sustained during that war. About three years ago Mr. Palmer was stricken blind. In addition to blindness he is a severe sufferer from rheumatism and requires an attendant constantly. He is without property and his wife, an elderly lady, is obliged to work in order to provide for herself and husband. He has repeatedly tried for an increase of his pension, but without success.
