STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to provide for repairs of road leading from Roach
river to the Grant farm.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of one thousand two hundred and fifty dollars to aid in the
3 repair of road leading from Roach river to the Grant farm,
4 so called, near the outlet of Ragged lake. The same to be
5 expended upon that portion of the road between the southerly
6 line of Township One (1) Range Thirteen (13), Piscataquis
7 county, and the Grant farm, under the direction of an agent
8 to be appointed for that purpose by the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The road for which this appropriation is sought is an important thoroughfare used very generally by lumber operators. Many hundreds of tons of supplies for the camps are annually transported over the road to be used in lumber operations. Hundreds of men journeying to and from the lumber camps pass over the road each year. There is a continually increasing travel over the road by tourists and sportsmen. There is a postoffice at the Grant farm. The road is now in bad repair and as it runs wholly through a wilderness and unincorporated townships, there are no persons willing to undertake the burden of putting the road in such condition as to be either safe or convenient for travelers.
