STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Bingham.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred sixty-four dollars
2 and three cents be and is hereby appropriated to aid the town
3 of Bingham in building and repairing the highway leading
4 to the Bingham and Concord bridge, to be expended under
5 the direction of the county commissioners of Somerset
6 county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1905 the sum of twenty thousand dollars was appropriated to build a bridge across the Kennebec river connecting the towns of Concord and Bingham. The county paid five thousand dollars and the towns paid by appropriation and subscription the sum of ten thousand dollars. The bridge cost \$3,302.89.

The appropriation was not available to build the approaches to the bridge. The towns had gone in debt to such an extent in building the bridge that they are not able to complete the approaches leading to the bridge, so that they can receive the benefit of said bridge. The banks rise abruptly on either side of the river and owing to the great cost of properly fixing the road that leads to the bridge the town asks that the sum returned to the state be appropriated to complete the approaches.
