RESOLVE, to provide water supply at State Camp Grounds.

Resolved, That the sum of three thousand dollars is hereby

- 2 appropriated for providing permanent water supply on State
- 3 Camp Grounds in Augusta.

All said money to be expended by Major General Augus-5 tus B. Farnham under the direction of the governor and 6 council.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Water in greater quantity is needed on state camp grounds. Between \$250.00 and \$300.00 are paid out each encampment for hauling water in barrels, a method at once expensive, inadequate and hazardous. No water for bathing purposes is furnished. The Augusta city engineers have estimated that water can be brought to the camp grounds pumped from a spring now owned by the state to a tank on the grounds and all proper and necessary use thereof made at a cost to the state not exceeding \$3000.00.
