STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Fenderson brook and all its
tributaries, in the town of Parsonsfield.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for a term of four years
2 to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time,
3 in Fenderson brook, so called, or in any of its tributaries
4 all in the town of Parsonsfield.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be liable to the same penalty as is provided in the
3 general law of the state for illegal fishing.
