STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Meadow Brook, so called, and its tributaries, in the County of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or 2 kill, at any time, in any way, any kind of fish in Meadow 3 brook, so called, being the main inlet of Howard's pond in 4 the town of Hanover, Oxford county; and also the tributaries of said brook; and for the purpose of this act, the 6 outlet of said brook, above which it shall be unlawful to fish, 7 shall be deemed to be a line drawn through a large rock 8 commonly known as Indian Rock in the bed of the aforego said brook, a short distance from the point or corner of 10 Fannie Holt's land on the easterly side of said stream, run-

11 ning thence at right angles with the thread of the stream 12 directly across the same to the westerly shore of said brook.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the 3 general law of the state for illegal fishing.
