STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Collins pond, so called, in the
town of Windham.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time for a period of five years
3 from the time this act takes effect in Collins pond, so called,
4 in the town of Windham, county of Cumberland.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars
3 nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and
4 a further penalty of one dollar for each fish caught, killed or
5 had in possession in violation of the provisions hereof.
