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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

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AN ACT relating to the Old Town Municipal Court in the  
county of Penobscot.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section twenty-four of chapter one hundred and  
2 fifty-three of the Special Laws of the year one thousand nine  
3 hundred and three, relating to the Old Town municipal  
4 court, is hereby amended by striking out the word, "execu-  
5 tive" in the third line of said section and inserting in place  
6 thereof the word, 'exclusive,' so that said section, as  
7 amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 24. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith  
9 are hereby repealed, but nothing in this act shall be construed

10 to authorize said court to infringe upon the exclusive juris-  
11 dictions heretofore conferred upon other municipal courts  
12 in said county of Penobscot except so far as such exclusive  
13 jurisdictions may be affected by the provisions of section  
14 four of this act.'

Sect. 2. The said Old Town municipal court, in addition  
2 to the jurisdiction in criminal matters heretofore conferred  
3 upon and now possessed by it, shall have original jurisdiction  
4 concurrent with the supreme judicial court in the county of  
5 Penobscot, of the offenses described in sections seventy-four  
6 and eighty of chapter fifty-two of the Revised Statutes, and,  
7 upon conviction, may punish for said crimes or offenses in  
8 the manner and to the extent now provided in said sections  
9 seventy-four and eighty.

Sect. 3. The salary of the recorder of said court is hereby  
2 fixed at four hundred dollars, annually, to be paid quarterly  
3 from the treasury of the county of Penobscot.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
