STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of an appropriation to erect a screen in the stream connecting Great lake and Long lake in the town of Belgrade, county of Kennebec.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars be and is 2 hereby appropriated for the purpose of erecting a screen in 3 the stream connecting Great lake and Long lake, in the town 4 of Belgrade, in the county of Kennebec, to be expended 5 under the direction of the commissioners of inland fisheries 6 and game, when the balance necessary to erect said screen, 7 as found by the commissioners, shall have been raised by the 8 citizens of the county of Kennebec and paid into the treasurer 9 of state for this purpose,—to aid in erecting this screen.

Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be 11 available until the town of Belgrade shall have, in legal town 12 meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town 13 meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume 14 all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free 15 from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not 16 become clogged and prevent the free running of the water 17 through the same.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Long lake is below Great lake in the natural flow of water, and Great lake has as tributaries East pond, North pond, Salmon lake and McGraw pond, all of which are excellent fishing and to a greater or less degree stored with migratory fish. There has also been erected upon the shores of Great lake a valuable fish hatchery so that it becomes of great importance that some screen should be erected between Great lake and Long lake to prevent migratory fish going out through Long lake and thence to the sea.
