## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Buxton.

---

*Resolved:* That the sum of one hundred twenty-six dollars  
2 and forty-seven cents (\$126.47) be appropriated to reim-  
3 burse the town of Buxton in the county of York and State  
4 of Maine, for money expended by it during the years 1899,  
5 1900, 1901-2 and 1906 in furnishing pauper supplies to  
6 Henry Grady.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Henry Grady married Lucy Grady in the year 1888 in New Hampshire, and lived in Conway, N. H., six years, and came to Buxton in the year 1894 and went to the home of Lucy Grady's father in said Buxton, and there lived for a few months and then moved to Biddeford and lived for a short time. Then afterwards Grady left the town of Buxton unaccompanied by his wife and deserted her for some time, then returned sometime previous to 1899, and during the period from 1894 up to the year 1899 he did not live for a continuous length of time sufficient to establish a pauper settlement in the town of Buxton. In the year 1899 he fell into distress in said town and he and his wife, Lucy Grady, and four minor children, whose ages ranged from three to twelve years of age, were supported continuously up to July 3rd, 1901. On July 3rd, 1901, Henry Grady died and was buried by the town. Since the year 1899, up to the first day of January, 1907, said town of Buxton has continuously furnished pauper supplies to the said widow and minor children of said Henry Grady, and during all this time she has lived in the town of Buxton and has not according to law acquired a pauper settlement in said town.
