STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT in relation to sessions of the Law Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 43 of Chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 2 amended by striking out all the words thereof after the word 3 "year" at the beginning of the fifth line of the section and 4 inserting in the place thereof the words 'Meetings of the 5 justices shall also be held at such times and places as the 6 chief justice shall appoint for the consideration and deter-7 mination of all cases and questions before submitted and 8 undetermined. Such meetings shall be held at least twice 9 in each year. Each justice shall be reimbursed by the State 10 for his expenses actually and reasonably incurred in attend-11 ing such meetings and the sessions of the law court upon

12 presentation to the Governor and Council of a detailed state-13 ment of such expenses.' So that said Section 43, as thus 14 amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 43. For the purposes of the law court the State shall constitute one district. The sessions of the court as a law court shall be holden at Augusta on the second Tues-18 day of December, at Bangor on the first Tuesday of June and at Portland on the fourth Tuesday of June in each year. Meetings of the justices shall also be held at such times and places as the chief justice shall appoint for the consideration and determination of all cases and questions before submitted and undetermined. Such meetings shall he held at least twice in each year. Each justice shall be reimbursed by the State for his expenses actually and reasonably incurred in attending such meetings and the sessions of the law court upon presentation to the Governor and Rouncil of a detailed statement of such expenses.'
