AN ACT in regard to the right of the peremptory challenge of jurors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section I. The right to challenge peremptorily any per-2 son called or returned to serve as a juror may be exercised 3 after it has been determined that the person so called or 4 returned stands indifferent.
 - Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
