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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

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AN ACT to amend Chapter 130 of the Special Laws of 1822  
as amended by Chapter 550 of the Special Laws of 1828,  
relating to taking fish in Dyer's River.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Chapter one hundred and thirty of the Special Laws of  
2 1822 as amended by chapter five hundred and fifty of the  
3 Special Laws of 1828, is hereby further amended by substi-  
4 tuting in section 2 of said chapter the word 'five' for the  
5 word "three" in the fourth line of said section, so that said  
6 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, that the inhabitants of said  
8 towns respectively, are hereby authorized and empowered

9 to take said fish within the limits of their respective towns,  
10 five days in each week; and the selectmen of each of said  
11 towns, shall annually, in the month of April, appoint the  
12 days in each week for taking said fish, and the place and  
13 manner of taking them, and post notifications thereof in  
14 some public place, in their respective towns, at least seven  
15 days before the said fifth day of May; and it shall be lawful  
16 for the said towns respectively, in legal town meeting, to  
17 sell and dispose of the privilege of taking said fish for any  
18 term not exceeding one year, at any one time, to any person  
19 or persons, under such restrictions and regulations as the  
20 said towns shall respectively direct, and the profits arising  
21 from such sale shall be appropriated to such purposes as the  
22 inhabitants of said town respectively shall order.'
