STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in relation to Fort William Henry in the town of
Bristol.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of three thousand dollars for the use of the Pemaquid
3 commissioners, the same to be used for the erection of a
4 memorial tower on the foundations of the castle or flanking
5 tower of Fort William Henry, and for the preservation of
6 the remains of said fort, and for such other purposes con-
7 nected with the care of the reservation and State property
8 thereunto appertaining as may, in their judgment, be neces-
9 sary.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The State of Maine owns the property. It has already expended about \$1400.

There have been expended by private persons about \$3000.

It is claimed that \$3500 will enable the commission to restore the tower and provide suitable room for the relics which have been recovered.

A commission of three persons appointed by the Governor of the State has the matter in charge.
