STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT in addition to chapter 97 of the Revised Statutes, relating to waste and trespass on real estate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever wilfully or knowingly cuts down,

- 2 destroys, injures or carries away, any ornamental or fruit
- 3 trees, timber, wood, underwood, stones, gravel, or goods
- 4 or property of any kind, from land not his own, without
- 5 license of the owner, or knowingly or wilfully injures or
- 6 throws down any fences, bars or gates, or leaves such gates
- 7 open, or breaks glass in any building, is liable in double
- 8 damages to the owner in an action of trespass.
