# STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT for the preservation and better protection of ballots.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section twenty-five of chapter six of the revised statutes is 2 hereby amended by adding in the sixteenth line after the 3 word "record" the words following: 'and shall be kept by 4 him securely locked in an iron safe whenever such city, town 5 or plantation shall so provide the same for his use as such 6 clerk,' and by adding after the word "ballots" in the nine-7 teenth line the words following: and any such clerk who shall 8 wilfully and intentionally refuse or neglect to so safely keep

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9 secured such ballots, as herein above provided,' so that said 10 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 25. No person shall take or remove any ballot from 12 the polling place before the close of the polls. If any voter 13 spoils a ballot he may successively obtain others, one at a 14 time, not exceeding three in all, upon returning each spoiled 15 one. The ballots thus returned shall be immediately can-16 celed, and together with those not distributed to the voters, 17 shall be preserved, and with the check lists used, which shall 18 be certified by the ballot clerks, to be such, shall be secured, 10 sealed, and sent to the several city, town and plantation clerks, 20 and by them be preserved for six months as a public record. 21 The ballots shall be sorted and counted in open town or ward 22 meeting in such manner as to afford the electors ample oppor-23 tunity to observe the sorting and counting; and when the 24 ballots have been sorted and counted and the results declared 25 and recorded, all the ballots shall, in open meeting, be sealed 26 in a package, which said package, together with the check 27 lists sealed in the same manner as the ballots, shall forthwith 28 be returned to the city, town or plantation clerk, to be pre-29 served by him as a public record, and shall be kept by him 30 securely locked in an iron safe, whenever such city, town or 31 plantation shall so provide the same for his use as such clerk, 32 for six months, and any warden, ballot clerk, city or town 33 clerk or other person who shall abstract from or in any man-34 ner tamper with said packages, or who shall in any manner 35 abstract from or tamper with the unused ballots, and any

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36 such clerk who shall wilfully and intentionally refuse or 37 neglect to so safely keep secured such ballots, as herein above 38 provided, shall be punished by a fine not less than two hun-39 dred nor more than one thousand dollars, or by imprison-40 ment for not less than ninety days nor more than two years.'
