IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT concerning the appointment of married women as
guardians.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

A married woman who has attained the age of twenty-one
2 years may be appointed guardian and perform all the duties
3 of such trust without any act or assent on the part of her
4 husband; and when an unmarried woman who is guardian
5 marries, her authority is not thereby extinguished, but she
6 shall continue to perform all the duties of such trust without
7 any act or assent on the part of her husband.
