STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to prohibit fishing in the brooks and streams flowing into George's River between the outlet of Quantebacook Pond in Searsmont and the dam across said George's River at North Appleton and in the tributaries to said brooks and streams.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill, at any
2 time, or in any way, prior to April 1, 1909, any trout or
3 landlocked salmon in any of the brooks and streams flowing
4 into Georges' River, between the outlet of Quantebacook
5 Pond in Searsmont and the dam across said George's River
6 at North Appleton, or in any of the tributaries to said brooks
7 and streams, under the same penalty as is provided in the
8 general laws of the State, for illegal fishing.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
