
AN ACT in the interest of humanity to animals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Any person setting a trap in any incorporated
- 2 place shall visit said trap, or cause the same to be visited, at
- 3 least once in every twenty-four hours and remove therefrom,
- 4 or cause to be removed, any animal found caught therein.
- Sect. 2. No person shall set traps on any cultivated land
- 2 without first obtaining the written consent of the owner or
- 3 occupant of the land on which said traps are to be set.
- Sect. 3. Any person violating the provisions of this act
- 2 shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty
- 3 dollars, and costs for each offense, to be paid to the State

4 Treasurer and credited to the fund for the protection of fish 5 and game.

Municipal and police courts and trial justices shall have 7 original jurisdiction in all cases arising under this act.
