STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to the disposal of the insurance due on the
Moosehead Lake Hatchery, recently burned.

Resolved, That the amount of money received for insurance on the Moosehead Lake Fish Hatchery and Feeding Station, recently burned, may be used by the commissioners of inland fisheries and game for the purpose of building a new hatchery at such place as in their judgment is suitable and will supply the lakes and ponds with fish that the hatchery recently burned supplied.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Moosehead lake hatchery, recently burned, was insured, and as the commissioners are somewhat in doubt as to their legal right to use the insurance money for the purpose of erecting a hatchery, as the insurance runs to the State, this resolve is introduced for the purpose of making this matter clear.
