## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An Act additional to chapter forty-nine of the Revised Statutes, relating to Insurance and Insurance Companies," approved March 6, 1907.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section one of said act is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after the word "life" in the third line thereof, the 3 word 'fire,' so that said section as amended shall read as .
- 4 follows:
  - 'Sect. 1. Every policy of insurance issued to a resident of
- 6 Maine by any insurance company, except a domestic, life, fire,
- 7 or stock insurance company, which contains a reference to

8 the application of the insured, either as a part of the policy 9 or as having any bearing thereon, must have attached thereto 10 a correct copy of the application, and unless so attached the 11 same shall not be considered a part of the policy or received 12 in evidence. Each application for such policy shall have 13 printed upon it or upon a slip attached thereto in large bold 14 faced type the following words: "Under the laws of Maine, 15 each applicant for a policy of insurance to be issued here-16 under is entitled to be furnished with a copy of this appli-17 cation attached to any policy issued thereon."

- Sect. 2. Section two of said act is hereby amended by sub2 stituting for the word "if" in the eleventh line thereof, the
  3 word 'of,' so that said section as amended shall read as
  4 follows:
- Sect. 2. Any person who knowingly or wilfully makes a 6 false or fraudulent statement or representation in or relative 7 to any application for accident, health or casualty insurance, 8 or who makes any such statement for the purpose of obtain-9 ing a fee, commission, money or benefit in a corporation to transacting such business in this state, shall be punished by 11 a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than five hun-12 dred dollars or by imprisonment for not less than thirty days 13 nor more than one year, or by both such fine and imprison-14 ment; and a person who wilfully makes a false statement of 15 any material fact or thing in a sworn statement as to the 16 death or disability of a policy or certificate holder in any such

17 corporation, for the purpose of procuring payment of a 18 benefit named in the certificate of such holder, shall be guilty 19 of perjury.'
