STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes relating to Employment of Minors in Manufacturing or Mechanical Establishments in this State.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 52 of chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes 2 is hereby amended by striking out the word "twelve" in the 3 first line of said section and substituting therefor the word 4 'fourteen' so that said section as amended shall read:

'Sect. 52. No child under fourteen years of age, shall be 6 employed in any manufacturing or mechanical establishment 7 in the state. Whoever, either for himself, or as superin-8 tendent, overseer or agent of another, employs or has in his 9 employment any child in violation of the provisions of this

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10 section, and every parent or guardian who permits any child11 to be so employed, shall be punished by a fine of not less12 than twenty-five, nor more than fifty dollars for each offense.'

Sect. 2. Section 53 of said chapter 40 is hereby repealed.
Sect. 3. Chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes is hereby
2 amended by inserting as section 53 of said chapter the
3 following:

'Sect. 53. Any child over fourteen years of age, and under 5 sixteen years of age, applying for employment in any manu-6 facturing or mechanical establishment in this state, or any 7 person applying in his behalf, shall produce and present to 8 the owner, superintendent or overseer of such establishment 9 a certified copy of the town clerk's record of the birth of 10 such child, or a certified copy of his baptismal record show-II ing the date of his birth, or his passport showing said date 12 of birth, and without the production and presentation of said 13 town record, baptismal record or passport, such child shall 14 not receive the employment applied for. The employer shall 15 retain such town record, baptismal record or passport and 16 shall issue to such child a certificate containing the name of 17 the child, the name of his parents, if living, or guardian if 18 any, with the residence of said child, parent or guardian, and 19 such other facts as may be required by the inspector of fac-20 tories, workshops, mines and quarries, which certificate shall 21 be furnished in blank by said inspector and shall be approved 22 as to form by the attorney general. The employer shall 23 furnish to said inspector a copy of each certificate thus 24 issued immediately after the issuance of the original, which 25 copy shall be retained by the inspector upon a file prepared 26 for that purpose. When such child leaves such employ-

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27 ment the employer shall return to such child the copy of 28 town record, baptismal record or passport furnished by him 29 as aforesaid and shall immediately notify said inspector that 30 such child has left his employment, and the date of such 31 leaving. The inspector of factories, workshops, mines and 32 quarries, or either of his assistants, may demand the names 33 of the children under sixteen years of age employed in such 34 establishment, in the several cities and towns of the state, 35 and may require that the certificates of age prescribed in this 36 section, shall be produced for his inspection, and a failure to 37 produce the same, shall be prima facie evidence that the 38 employment of such child is illegal.'

Sect. 4. Section 55 and section 56 of said chapter 40 are 2 hereby repealed.
