STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the use of certain Roads in the town of
Mount Desert.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The town of Mount Desert, in the county of
2 Hancock, at any legal meeting of the voters thereof, may
3 adopt by-laws prohibiting the use of automobiles on the
4 following named sections of road within its limits, which
5 having steep grades and being narrow and circuitous are
6 are unsuitable and dangerous for their use, to wit, from the
7 Mill Brook bridge in Northeast Harbor, northerly over the
8 Sargent drive to the bridge over Sargent's brook, so-called;
9 from the corner at Asticou, easterly and southerly to Little
10 Harbor brook bridge, so-called; from the bridge at the head
11 of Otter Creek, southerly to the bridge over Hunter's Beach

12 brook; from the bridge over Mill Pond brook in Somesville,
13 northerly to the Doctor's Creek bridge, so-called; from
14 Hutcthinson's corner, so-called, in Somesville, westerly to
15 the bridge at the head of Great pond, so-called. Any section
16 of this road so closed shall be marked at the entrance thereof
17 by sign boards in large letters "No Automobiles Allowed on
18 This Road."

The term "automobile" as used in this section, applies to all
20 motor vehicles propelled by power. The town of Mount
21 Desert may vote at said meeting what punishment shall be
22 inflicted for the violation of such by-laws, but for the first
23 offense, not over twenty-five dollars and cost of prosecution,
24 and for the second offense, not over twenty-five dollars and
25 thirty days imprisonment, or both, and cost of prosecution.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
