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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

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AN ACT to make plain the provisions of Section 9, Chapter 139  
of the Revised Statutes, relating to extradition.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. In order that the meaning of Sec. 9, Chap. 139  
2 of the Revised Statutes may be made plain and more certain,  
3 said section is amended so as to read as follows:

“Sect. 9. When such demand as is mentioned in Section  
5 seven is made on the governor of this state, he may investi-  
6 gate all the material facts which come to his knowledge and  
7 determine the expediency of complying therewith, and if he

8 is satisfied, on examination of the grounds thereof, that it is  
9 according to law and ought to be granted, he shall issue his  
10 warrant, under the seal of the state, authorizing the agent  
11 making the demand, at his own expense to take and trans-  
12 port such fugitive to the line of the state at the time desig-  
13 nated in the warrant, and shall therein require the civil offi-  
14 cers of the state to afford all needful aid in its execution.”

Sect. 2. Said Act shall take effect when approved.
