## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section seventeen of Chapter forty-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to measurement of lobsters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section seventeen of chapter forty-one of the

- 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the
- 3 word "catch" in the first line thereof; also by striking out
- 4 the words "ten and one half" in the second line thereof and
- 5 inserting in their place the words 'four and three-fourths';
- 6 also by striking out the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth
- 7 lines and the words "stretching or pulling" in the ninth line
- 8 and inserting in their place the following words: 'end of the

9 bone of the nose to the rear end of the body shell,' so that 10 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 17. No person shall buy or sell, give away or expose 12 for sale or possess for any purpose any lobster less than 13 four and three-fourth inches in length, alive or dead, cooked 14 or uncooked, measured in manner as follows: taking the 15 length of the back of the lobster measured from the end of 16 the bone of the nose to the rear end of the body shell; and 17 any lobster shorter than the prescribed length when caught 18 shall be liberated alive at the risk and cost of the parties 19 taking them, under a penalty of one dollar for each lobster 20 so caught, bought, sold, given away, exposed for sale or in 21 possession. The possession of mutilated lobsters, cooked or 22 uncooked, shall be prima facie evidence that they are not 23 of the required length. All lobsters or parts of lobsters 24 sold for use in this state or for export therefrom must be 25 sold and delivered in the shell under a penalty of twenty 26 dollars for each offense, and whoever ships, buys, gives 27 away, sells or exposes for sale lobster meat after the same 28 shall have been taken from the shell shall be liable to a 29 penalty of one dollar for each pound of meat so bought, sold, 30 given away, exposed for sale or shipped. Any person or 31 corporation in the business of a common carrier of merchan-32 dise, who shall knowingly carry or transport from place to 33 place lobster meat after the same shall have been taken from 34 the shell shall be liable to a penalty of fifty dollars upon 35 each conviction thereof. All lobster meat so illegaly bought, 36 shipped, sold, given away, exposed for sale or transported 37 shall be liable to seizure and may be confiscated. Nothing 38 contained herein shall be held to prohibit the sale of lobsters 39 that have been legally canned.'
