STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to prohibit the sale of trout in Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or 2 kill any trout in any of the waters lying wholly or partly in 3 the county of Hancock for sale, and it shall likewise be unlaw-4 ful to sell or offer for sale, directly or indirectly, any trout 5 in said Hancock county, and it shall likewise be unlawful to 6 take, catch, kill or have in possession in any one day more 7 than twenty-five pounds of black bass from any of the 8 waters lying wholly or partly in the towns of Eden, Mt. 9 Desert, Tremont, Hancock, Sullivan, Franklin, Eastbrook, 10 Waltham and townships number 7, number 10, and number 11 21, in the county of Hancock.

Sect. 2. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of 2 this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten 3 dollars nor more than thirty dollars for each offense and 4 one dollar additional for every fish caught had in possession 5 or sold in violation of the provisions of this act.

Sect. 3. That part of Section 3 of the Private and Special2 Laws of 1903, Chapter 407, denominated "Hancock County"3 is hereby repealed.
