STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to create a lien on manufactured staves and laths.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Whoever labors at cutting, hauling or sawing of stave,
2 lath, or dowel timber or in the manufacture of stave, lath,
3 or dowel timber into staves, laths, or dowels and the piling
4 of such staves or laths and the bunching of such dowels
5 or at cooking for persons engaged in such labor has a lien
6 therein for the amount due for his personal services and the
7 services performed by his team, which takes precedence of
8 all other claims, continues for sixty days after such timber
9 or staves, laths and dowels are manufactured, provided the
10 same have not been sold and shipped.
