

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, to encourage the utilization of tidal and sea power in the State of Maine.

Resolved, That for the purpose of demonstrating the 2 efficacy of any mechanism for the utilization of tidal and 3 sea power, the inevntion of a citizen of Maine and upon his 4 request, the Governor and Council are authorized to expend 5 for the service of mechanical experts the sum of five hun-6 dred dollars, which is hereby appropriated.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The State of Maine possesses the longest distance coast line on the Atlantic seaboard of the United States, and the history of our seaboard towns is one of depleted population.

It is a duty which the State owes the seaboard towns to relieve this distressful situation and to aid them if it can in the establishment of useful industries, of which economy in production of power, light and heat is a primary force.

Tidal powers now in disuse have served our ancestors in the manufacture of lumber and other products.
