IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section 17 of chapter 80 of the Revised Statutes relating to the power of County Commissioners to raise temporary loans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 17 of chapter 80 of the Revised Stat-2 utes is hereby amended;

By striking out the word "county" after the word "Cumber-

- 4 land" and before the word "may" in the first line, and insert-
- 5 ing in the place thereof the words 'and Kennebec counties';

By striking out the words "the county" in the second line

7 and inserting in the place thereof the words 'their respective

8 counties';

By striking out the words "said county" in the fourth line 10 and inserting in the place thereof the words 'their respective 11 counties';

By striking out the words "said county" in the fifth line 13 and inserting in the place thereof the words 'their respective 14 counties'; so that said section, as amended, shall read as 15 follows:

'Sect. 17. The county commissioners of Cumberland and 17 Kennebec counties may, without obtaining the consent of 18 their respective counties, raise, by temporary loan to be paid 19 within one year from the time when the same is contracted, 20 a sum not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, in any year for 21 use of their respective counties, and cause notes or obligations 22 of their respective counties with coupons for lawful interest 23 to be used for payment thereof, as aforesaid.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
