### STATE OF MAINE.

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT in relation to the Union Water Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. The Union Water Power Company of Lewiston, 2 its successors and assigns, in addition to the rights, privileges 3 and powers now possessed by said corporation by virtue of 4 its organization under the general laws of Maine and by 5 chapter four hundred and forty-eight of the Private and 6 Special Laws of Maine, approved February 24th, 1885, is 7 hereby granted the right to dredge, deepen, straighten and 8 improve the outlets and outlet streams of both the Moose-

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9 lucmaguntic and Richardson lakes in the county of Oxford, 10 Maine, and to draw down the waters of said lakes or either II of them to the level of the sill of the deep gates now in the 12 dams maintained by said company at the outlets of each of 13 said lakes when necessary to maintain a flow of water in the 14 Androscoggin river through Errol dam in the state of New 15 Hampshire, of not more than fourteen hundred (1,400) cubic 16 feet of water per second,-provided, however, that the sills 17 of the deep gates now in the dams at the outlets of each of 18 said lakes shall not be lowered from their present elevation, 19 nor the waters of either of said lakes drawn below the pres-20 ent level of said sills, and that the waters of said lakes shall 21 not be drawn below the natural low water level of said lakes 22 between the first days of April and December in each year; 23 and provided further that the rights granted herein shall not 24 be exercised by the Union Water Power Company until a 25 dam shall have been erected across Rapid river, at the outlet 26 of pond in the river, so called, below Middle dam, so as to 27 aid in better controlling the water used in driving logs and 28 thereby diminish the quantity of water to be drawn from said 29 lakes for log driving purposes.

Sect. 2. The Union Water Power Company shall be liable 2 for any legal damages sustained by any persons in property 3 by the drawing down of the waters of said lakes under the 4 provisions of this act below the natural low water level of 5 said lakes, and in case the parties are unable to agree upon 6 the amount of such damages, the same may be determined

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7 upon the application of either party made within two years 8 after the damages are caused to the county commissioners of 9 Oxford county, who shall assess the damages legally recover-10 able in the same manner and under the same restrictions, 11 conditions, limitations, and rights of appeal as are by law 12 provided in the case of laying out of highways, so far as such 13 provisions are applicable thereto.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

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Section 1. The Union Water Power Company of Lewiston, 2 its successors and assigns, in addition to the rights, privileges 3 and powers now possessed by said corporation by virtue of 4 its organization under the general laws of Maine and by 5 chapter 448 of the Private and Special Laws of Maine, 6 approved February 24, 1885, is hereby granted the right to 7 dredge, deepen, straighten and improve the outlets and out-8 let streams of both the Mooselucmaguntic and Richardson 9 lakes in the county of Oxford, Maine, and to draw down the 10 waters of said lakes or either of them to the level of the sill 11 of the deep gates now in the dams maintained by said com12 pany at the outlets of each of said lakes, provided, however,13 that the waters of said lakes shall not be drawn below the14 natural low water level of said lakes between the first days15 of April and November in each year.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### MAJORITY REPORT.

The Committee on Legal Affairs to which was referred the bill, entitled "An Act in relation to the Union Water Power Company" have had the same under consideration and ask leave to report the same in a new draft, under the same title, and that it ought to pass.
