STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT in relation to transportation of state officials.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. The state treasurer, whenever requested in
- 2 writing by any member or member-elect of the legislature so
- 3 do so, shall procure from such railroad company or companies
- 4 as may be necessary such ticket or tickets as will enable such
- 5 member or member-elect to travel from his home or from
- 6 the railroad station most convenient for such member or
- 7 member-elect to the state capitol and back again once a week
- 8 each week during any session of the legislature, which ticket
- 9 or tickets the state treasurer shall deliver to said member or
- 10 member-elect upon receiving from him an assignment to the

11 state of his mileage allowance for such session, which assign12 ment shall be received in full payment for such ticket or
13 tickets. The state treasurer shall pay for the tickets so pro14 cured by him the lowest sum or sums for which they can
15 be obtained of the railroad companies.

- Sect. 2. No railroad company shall knowingly issue to any 2 member or member-elect of the legislature any ticket or other 3 token which will entitle any member or member-elect of the 4 legislature to transportation over its lines excepting upon the 5 same terms and at the same price as tickets are ordinarily 6 issued by said company.
- Sect. 3. No railroad company shall knowingly issue to any 2 state, county or municipal officer any ticket, pass or other 3 token entitling him to transportation over its lines excepting 4 upon the same terms and at the same price as tickets are 5 ordinarily issued by said company.
- Sect. 4. The provisions of this act shall not prohibit the 2 issuance and interchange of passes for the officers, agents, 3 employees, surgeons and attorneys and their families of 4 railroads and other carriers, nor to the railroad commissioners 5 and their clerks, nor to game wardens.
