SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL.

Whereas, there is a general demand by the people of the 2 United States and of the State of Maine for better and more 3 permanent public roads:

Therefore, be it Resolved, by the Senate of the state of 5 Maine, the House concurring, that it is the sense of the 6 people of this state that the national government should aid 7 in the construction of permanent public highways, and that 8 the Congress of the United States is hereby memorialized 9 to authorize the loan of public money by the treasurer of the 10 United States for the construction and improvement of post 11 roads, in such sums and under such conditions as may be 12 deemed advisable.

Be it further Resolved, that a copy of this memorial be sent 14 to the Senate and House of Representatives of the United 15 States, in Congress assembled, and to the legislatures of the 16 several states of the Union by the secretary of state.
