
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 13 of Chapter 117, of the Revised Statutes, relating to witness fees before referees, auditors or commissioners.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirteen of chapter one hundred and seventeen of 2 the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting in the 3 second line of said section after the word "court" and before 4 the word "shall," the words 'and before referees, auditors 5 or commissioners specially appointed to take testimony,' and 6 by striking out in the fifth and sixth lines of said section 7 the words "referees, auditors or commissioners specially 8 appointed to take testimony," so that said section as amended 9 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 13. Witnesses in the supreme judicial or superior courts, and in the probate court, and before referees, auditors or commissioners, specially appointed to take testimony, shall receive one dollar and fifty cents, or before the county commissioners one dollar for each day's attendance, and six cents for each mile's travel going out and returning home; and before a justice of the peace, a trial justice, a judge of a municipal or police court, fifty cents a day for attendance, and for travel the same as at the courts aforesaid.'
