STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Washburn pond and tributaries.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Washburn pond, so called,
3 situated in Garland village in the county of Penobscot, or in
4 any of its tributaries, for a period of three years from May
5 first, A. D. 1907.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
2 shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the
3 general law of the state for illegal fishing.
