## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to ascertain the will of the people as to resubmitting the twenty-sixth amendment of the Constitution relating to the prohibition of the manufacture and sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, selectmen of towns 2 and assessors of plantations, in the state, are hereby empow-3 ered and directed to notify the inhabitants of their respective 4 cities, towns and plantations, at the annual meeting in Sep-5 tember, nineteen hundred and eight, to give in their votes 6 upon the following question: "Ought the twenty-sixth 7 amendment of the Constitution, relating to the prohibition of 8 the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors, to be resub-9 mitted to the people;" and the inhabitants of the cities, towns 10 and plantations shall vote by ballot on said question, those in

11 favor of said resubmission voting "yes," and those opposed
12 voting "no," upon their ballots. Said questions shall be so
13 submitted to the vote of the people and the ballots therefor
14 prepared, and the marking thereof by voters shall all be in
15 the same manner as provided by law in voting upon amend16 ments to the Constitution. The ballots shall be received,
17 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and planta18 tion meetings, and fair lists of the votes shall be made out
19 by aldermen of cities, selectmen of towns and assessors of
20 plantations, signed by them and attested by the clerk, and
21 returned to the office of the secretary of state, in the same
22 manner as votes for representatives, and the governor and
23 council shall open and examine and count the same, and the
24 governor shall make proclamation of the results thereof.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall prepare and fur-26 nish the several cities, towns and plantations, blank returns 27 in conformity with the foregoing resolve, accompanied by a 28 copy thereof. · \_
