STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the use of a certain road in the town of
Readfield.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The town of Readfield, in the county of Ken-
2 nebec, at any legal meeting of the voters thereof may
3 adopt by-laws prohibiting the use of automobiles on the
4 following-named road within its limits, which, being nar-
5 row and circuitous, is unsuitable and dangerous for their
6 use, to wit: The Pond Road so-called being the road begin-
7 ning at the road leading from Readfield to Kents Hill near
8 the saw mill and running thence northwesterly to the road
9 leading from Mount Vernon to Kents Hill. Said road shall
10 be marked at the entrance thereof by sign boards, in large

11 letters, "NO AUTOMOBILES ALLOWED ON THIS
12 ROAD." The term "automobile" as used in this section
13 applies to all motor vehicles propelled by power. The town
14 of Readfield may vote at said meeting what punishment
15 shall be inflicted for the violation of such by-laws; but, for
16 the first offense not over twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and
17 cost of prosecution, and for the second offense not over
18 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and thirty days imprisonment
19 or both and cost of prosecution.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
