IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section 108 of chapter 6 of the Revised Statutes Relating to Political Caucuses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 108 of chapter 6 of the Revised Stat-

- 2 ute is hereby amended by inserting after the word "secre-
- 3 tary" in the first line of said section the following words,
- 4 'or by a majority of the committee' so that said section as
- 5 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 108. Notice of caucuses, signed by the chairman

- 7 and secretary, or by a majority of the committee, shall be
- 8 issued by each town committee not less than seven days prior
- 9 to the day on which the caucuses are to be held. They shall
- 10 be conspicuously posted in at least five places on the high-

11 ways of each voting precinct, and shall state the place, day
12 and hour of holding such caucuses. In case voting is by
13 check list a sufficient time shall be allowed for all to vote,
14 and the call for the caucus shall state the hours fixed by the
15 committee for the opening and closing of the polls.
