### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to incorporate Dr. King's Hospital.


## Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Alfred King, Nellie T. King, Frances O. King,

- 2 their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated and
- 3 made a body politic, by the name of Dr. King's Hospital,
- 4 and by that name may sue and be sued and may have a com-
- 5 mon seal and shall have all the immunities and privileges
- 6 and be subject to all the liabilities of like corporations.
- Sect. 2. Said corporation may take, receive, purchase, hold
- 2 and possess lands and tenements in fee simple or otherwise
- 3 and dispose of and sell the same and may erect, support and
- 4 maintain a hospital for the treatment of the sick, for the
- 5 training of nurses and for the advancement of the science
- 6 of medicine, to be located within the city of Portland.

Sect. 3. The governor of the State, the president of the 2 senate, the speaker of the house of representatives for the 3 time being, and such person or persons as the governor may 4 appoint shall be a board of visitors of said hospital with 5 authority to visit the same as often as they may think proper, 6 to inspect the establishment and the actual condition of the 7 sick, to examine the by-laws and regulations of the corporation and generally to see that the design of the institution is 9 carried into effect.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
