STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Freedom Academy.

Resolved, That there be paid to the trustees of Freedom
2 Academy the sum of two thousand dollars to aid in the con-
3 struction of a new dormitory for the use of the academy,
4 provided that the total cost of the dormitory shall be not
5 less than four thousand dollars. The said sum of two
6 thousand dollars shall be paid to the said trustees when the
7 dormitory is completed and ready for occupancy.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1903 this academy lost a dormitory by fire which was owned by individual members of the association, and on the, twenty-eighth of January, 1907, a second dormitory for the academy was burned. This building has been used by the students and was owned by members of the association who purchased the same for the convenience of the scholars. The public have a great interest in the school and have already subscribed one thousand dollars towards a new building.
