STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter nine of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and three, relating to the compensation of Selectmen.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section eighty-nine of chapter nine of the
2 Public Laws of nineteen hundred and three is hereby
3 amended so as to read as follows:

'Sect. 89. If any town does not choose assessors, or if so
5 many of them refuse to accept, that there are not such a
6 number as the town voted to have, the selectmen shall be
7 the assessors, and each of them shall be sworn as an asses-
8 sor, and each selectman and assessor shall be paid for his
9 services two dollars and fifty cents for every day necessarily

10 and actually employed in the service of the town. Towns
11 having four thousand or more inhabitants may vote to pay
12 their selectmen a compensation not exceeding five dollars
13 a day, for time actually spent in the service of the town.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
