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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

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AN ACT to amend chapter forty-nine of the Revised Statutes,  
relating to life insurance.

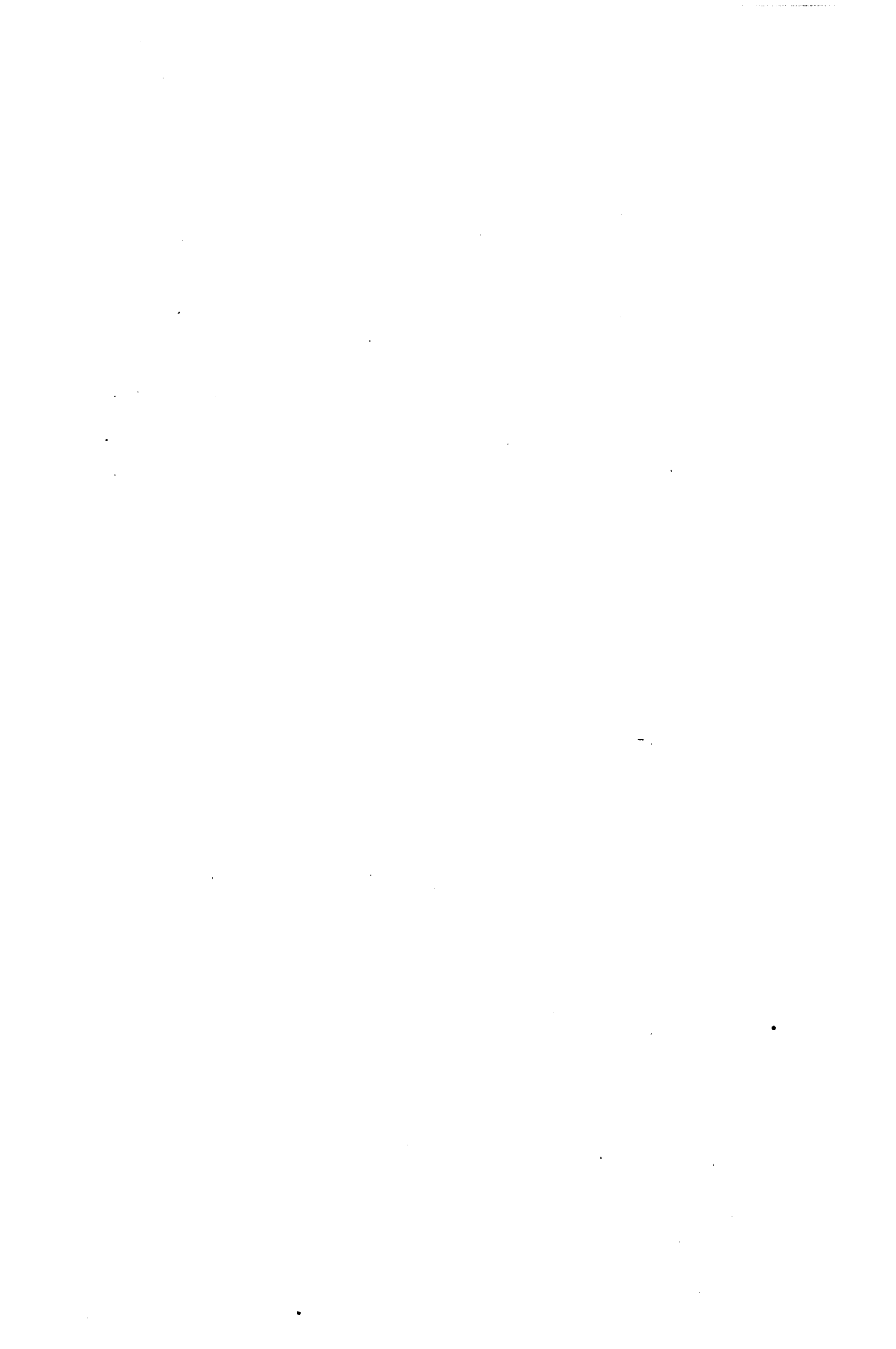
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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Chapter forty-nine of the Revised Statutes is  
2 hereby amended by repealing section one hundred five of  
3 said chapter and inserting in place thereof the following:

‘Sect. 105. No person shall be excused from attending and  
5 testifying, or producing any books, paper or other docu-  
6 ments before any court or magistrate having jurisdiction  
7 upon any investigation, proceeding or trial, for a violation  
8 of any of the provisions of this act, upon the ground or for  
9 the reason that the testimony or evidence, documentary or  
10 otherwise, required of him may tend to incriminate or de-

11 grade him ; but no person shall be prosecuted or subjected  
12 to any penalty or forfeiture for or on account of any trans-  
13 action, matter or thing concerning which he may testify or  
14 produce evidence, documentary or otherwise, and no testi-  
15 mony so given or produced shall be used against him upon  
16 any criminal investigation or proceeding.'
