STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section 30 of chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 7, chapter 132 of the Public Laws of 1905.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 30 of chapter 32 of the Revised Stat-2 utes as amended by section 7 of chapter 132 of the Public 3 Laws of 1905, is hereby amended to read as follows: "The 4 commissioners may annually issue licenses to suitable per-5 sons to buy and sell or tan deer skins, otter skins, sable skins 6 and fisher skins and the heads of deer if not detached from 7 the skins. Such persons shall keep a record of all such

8 heads and skins purchased, of whom purchased and the date 9 of purchase, and shall report annually to the commissioners. 10 The fee for such license shall be five dollars for a county 11 license and ten dollars for a State license, to be paid to the 12 commissioners and by them to the treasurer of state; and 13 whoever, licensed as aforesaid, unreasonably and wilfully 14 refuses to make such report, shall be punished by a fine of 15 \$100 and costs. Whoever buys such skins and heads with-16 out being licensed as above provided, shall be punished by 17 a fine of \$100 and costs.'

Sect. 2. No non-resident or unnaturalized foreign born 2 resident of this State shall buy and sell the skins of any wild 3 animals without being first licensed therefor and paying a 4 fee to the commissioners of inland fisheries and game of ten 5 dollars; and whoever licensed as aforesaid unreasonably and 6 wilfully refuses to make such report as is provided in the 7 above section shall be punished by a fine of \$100 and costs. 8 Whoever buys such skins and heads without being licensed 9 as above provided shall be punished by a fine of \$100 and 10 costs. . t
