IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to authorize the appointment of a chaplain for the Cumberland county jail.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The county commissioners of the county of

2 Cumberland may appoint some suitable person chaplain of

3 the Cumberland county jail, whose duties shall be to perform

4 religious services in the chapel of said jail every Sunday,

5 visit the sick inmates, labor diligently and faithfully for the

6 mental, moral and religious improvement of the prisoners,

7 and aid them when practicable in reaching their homes and

8 in obtaining employment after their discharge. Said chap-

9 lain may receive a salary of not exceeding \$400 per annum 10 to be paid quarterly out of the county treasury for said 11 county upon warrants issued therefor by the county com12 missioners.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
