STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE providing for the amendment of section seventeen chapter sixty of the Revised Statutes relating to the use of the score card by Agricultural Societies.

Resolved, That such portion of section seventeen, chapter 2 sixty, of the Revised Statutes as pertains to the use of the 3 score card system in the judging of horses, cattle, sheep and 4 swine be stricken out, so that the section as amended shall 5 read as follows:

'Sect. 17. The payment of the annual appropriations to the 7 state fairs and the payment of the state stipend to all other 8 agricultural societies receiving a three hundred dollar stipend 9 or more shall be conditional upon the use of the score card 10 system in the judging of dairy products. A copy of each 11 score card as filled by the judge shall be delivered to the 12 exhibitor of each exhibit.
