STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Bridgton Academy.

Resolved, That there be appropriated for the use of the
2 trustees of Bridgton Academy the sum of three thousand
3 dollars for the purpose of building a dormitory, installing
4 heat, and for the purchase of furniture for the building, pro-
5 vided that at least an equal sum be raised by the trustees of
6 said academy for the same purpose.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Bridgton Academy has an attendance of about one hundred students from many different sections of the state. The facilities for boarding and rooming students are so inadequate as to be a serious embarrassment to the authorities of the institution. It is believed that the sum of six thousand dollars will provide for the present needs of the school in this direction and for the probable needs in the immediate future.
