STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT relating to attendance of witnesses at court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 115 of chapter 84 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 2 amended by striking out the words "not exceeding twenty" 3 in the fifth line and inserting in place thereof the words 'not

4 exceeding one hundred,' so that said section as amended

5 shall read as follows:

'Section I. When a person, summoned, and obliged to 7 attend before any judicial tribunal, fails to do so without 8 reasonable excuse, he is liable to the party aggrieved for all 9 damages sustained thereby. The judge or justice of such to tribunal may issue a capias to apprehend and bring such

11 delinquent before him; and he may be fined not exceeding
12 one hundred dollars and costs of attachment, and committed
13 until the same and costs are paid.'
