STATE OF MAINE.

Whereas this legislature has submitted to the people the following amendment to the Constitution:

"RESOLVE proposing an amendment to section 12, article V, part first, of the Constitution of the State of Maine relating to the power of the governor to cause the laws to be faithfully executed.

Resolved, Two-thirds of both houses of the legislature con-2 curring that the following amendment of the Constitution 3 of the state be proposed, viz.:

Sect. 12. Article V, part first of the Constitution is 5 amended by adding thereto the following: 'Sheriffs shall 6 obey all orders of the governor directing them to diligently 7 and faithfully enforce the laws of the state. Upon their 8 neglect or refusal so to do, they may be removed, after hear-9 ing, and their successors appointed by the governor. The

10 legislature shall enact laws to carry these provisions into 11 effect.' So that said section as amended shall read as fol-12 lows:

'Sect. 12. He shall take care that the laws be faithfully 14 executed. Sheriffs shall obey all orders of the governor 15 directing them to diligently and faithfully enforce the laws 16 of the state. Upon their neglect or refusal so to do, they 17 may be removed, after hearing, and their successors 18 appointed by the governor. Any vacancies caused by such 19 removal shall be filled by appointment from the political 20 party to which the person so removed belong. The legisla-21 ture shall enact laws to carry these provisions into effect.'

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, selectmen of towns 23 and assessors of plantations of this state are hereby empow-24 ered and directed to notify the inhabitants of their respective 25 cities, towns and plantations, in the manner prescribed by 26 law at their next meetings in the month of September of the 27 election of said officers in the year of our Lord one thousand 28 nine hundred and eight, to give in their votes in the manner 29 prescribed by law, on the question whether the amendment 30 to the Constitution proposed by the foregoing resolve shall 31 be made, and the question so proposed shall be: Shall the 32 Constitution be amended so as to authorize the removal of 33 sheriffs found guilty of neglecting or refusing to obey direc-34 tions of the governor to faithfully and diligently enforce the 35 laws of the state. And the inhabitants of said cities, towns 36 and plantations shall vote by ballot on said question, in the

37 manner now prescribed by law; those in favor of said 38 amendment expressing it by the word "Yes" upon their bal39 lot, and those opposed to said question expressing it by plac40 ing the word "No" upon their ballot, and the ballots shall 41 be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town 42 and plantation meeting and the lists of the votes so received 43 shall be made and returned to the secretary of state in the 44 same manner as votes for governor, and the governor and 45 council shall count the same and the governor shall make a 46 proclamation on the result thereof, and if a majority of the 47 votes so cast are in favor of said amendment, the Constitu48 tion shall be amended accordingly and such amendment shall 49 take effect on the first Wednesday of January, nineteen hun50 dred and nine.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall prepare and fur-52 nish the several cities, towns and plantations with ballots and 53 blank returns in conformity to the foregoing resolves, accom-54 panied with a copy thereof."

Now therefore, be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Chapter ninety-two of the Public Laws of 1905 2 is hereby repealed in case of the adoption of the said Con-3 stitutional amendment.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when said amendment is 2 adopted.
