STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the University of Maine.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated annually

- 2 for six years, for the University of Maine, out of any
- 3 moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum
- 4 of money for general maintenance which shall be equivalent
- 5 to one-fifth of one mill on the dollar of the valuation of the
- 6 State, for each of said years or made by the State assessors.

And that there be and hereby is appropriated annually for

- 8 six years for the University of Maine, out of the moneys
- 9 in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum of money
- 10 for buildings which shall be equivalent to one-fifth of one
- II mill on the dollar of the valuation of the State for each of
- 12 said years or made by the State assessors.
